

Abstract

The goal of this thesis, *Prague Manifest of Thomas Müntzer. Attempting to Contemporary Classification and Analysis of the Reform Document*, is to present Thomas Müntzer, primarily through his own work, the so-called *Prague Manifest* (Pražský manifest). Müntzer wrote this text in 1521, at the end of his stay in Prague, where he - unsuccessfully - tried to get the Czechs to accept his ideas. He created three different versions of this text, one in Latin, two in German, one of which has been preserved also in an unfinished contemporary Czech translation. The core of this thesis is an analysis of the main topics of one of these versions. Apart from that, there is a summary of the basic facts about *Prague Manifest* itself. Furthermore, the thesis describes the religious situation of Bohemia in the time of Müntzer's arrival and the research results of this visit of his. The whole thesis is opened with a brief introduction of Müntzer's life and work. A tentative translation of the analyzed version of *Prague Manifest* from the German original is appended at the end of this thesis.
