Prevention of secondary cholesteatoma I chose based on their interest in this issue, resulting in the third degree Medical School.

The issue of retraction pockets and cholesteatomas considered significant due to the relatively frequent occurrence, with no early diagnosis and appropriate treatment can lead to serious complications such as hearing loss, destruction temporal bones, etc. While the most common cause of hearing loss in infants and younger children with cleft lip and palate is very clearly an inflammatory process otitis media secretoria with an incidence of approximately 90% in older children, adolescents and adults dominate rather its consequences in the form of chronic otitis, and adhesive - retraction processes in 20-40% or perforation of the tympanic membrane and mainly the most serious of these, cholesteatoma 2-10%.
