Dear friends,

1. *Part of questions*

How long are you working at Mjam? Are you *echte* or *freie Dienstnehmer*? How many hours for a week are you working usually?

Could you tell me how does your working day look like? What is essential knowledge or skill for this job?

Do you like/enjoy your work? Would you say that what you do is meaningful at least at some extent?

2. *Part of questions*

What would you say are the meaningful aspects of your job? Does such an experience motivate you to further work? Could you describe your feelings and emotions? Was something special about this experience?

What would say that make your job less meaningful? How does that make you feel? Could you describe your feelings and emotions? Was something special about this experience?

Do you think that your work in *Mjam* is more or less meaningful in compare to other jobs, you've done before?

3. *Part of questions*

Did your perception of meaningfulness change during your employment by *mjam*?

How does the creation of labour unions affect the perception of your work and its meaningfulness?

Does the coronavirus crisis change your feelings about the meaningfulness of your work?

How does the employer try to motivate you to work? Does the employer talks about meaningfulness of your work in some way? Do you feel that it is a topic for the company?
