## Abstract

Theme. Prayer for liberation and to healing in the perspective of practical theology and helping professions. Current issues/questions.

The theme of the thesis deals with the issue of prayer for liberation and healing The thesis is dividend into five parts. The first charter brings a deeper reflection of selected concepts of practiacal theology that are related to the content and form a basic introducction to understanding the kontext. In more detail, it also shows and interprets individual passages of Matthew, Mark and Luke's Gospels. The final synthesis of the charter outlines suggestions for cooperation among other science — psychology, pedagogy, medicine. The aim of this approach is to point out the doop biblical connections and pastoral practice of the present.

The second charter daels with issue of service for liberation and healing, reflexts topics such as conversion, forgiveness, attitudes and values of an individual, work with trauma and negative emotions. It shows specific starting points and impulses in practice concerning pastoral assistants, clergymen and spiritual accompanists, or the theology students, who want to pursue this field.

The third charter introduces the current issues of spiritual accopaniment – in postmodern thinking, the specifics of the care and development of spiritual life, including mysticis, magic and occultism, ort he New Age movement. It also provils a comparison of psychotherapy and prayer for liberation.

The fourth and fifth chapters deal with the empirical investigation; i tis case studies focused on the prayer for liberation and healing in the perspecitve of specific individuals who have experienced signifiant spiritual or mental difficulties Which are commented on and provide a more cohorent insight into the issue. The fifth charter reflects the outcomes of the questionnaire surfy in the field of ecumenical dialogue of different churches and the knowledge of the respondents in this field.
