Title: The Use of Craft and Creative Arts in Occupational Therapy

Abstract:

The bachelor thesis addresses the topic of Arts and Crafts in occupational therapy.

Arts and Craft are linked with the profession from its beginnings. Craft activities were one of

the first meaningful occupations the occupational therapists ever used in their work. These

activities were also the first occupations expertly analyzed by occupational therapists. As the

society evolved, the role of arts and crafts in occupational therapy changed. Today, the use of

Arts and Crafts in therapy is a controversial topic that divides occupational therapists. Some

see Arts and Crafts only as a historical part of the profession, outdated and anachronistic, and

refuse to use them in their work. Others feel their potential and try to find ways of

purposefully including them in their patients' rehabilitation plans.

The bachelor thesis presents a view of Arts and Crafts as a therapeutic tool. It charts

the inclusion of these activities in the history of the profession and describes the current

situation. It also identifies the problems that occupational therapists face when including these

activities in their therapy. The aim of the study was to describe the prevalence, frequency and

purpose of the use of creative activities in occupational therapy in the Czech Republic. The

research was carried out by an internet based survey that collected responses from 106

respondents, out of whom a majority (55,66 %) includes crafts in their work with patients.

The thesis examines the use of arts and crafts in the therapy of adult patients who

suffered a stroke and developed hemiparesis as a result. The integration of these techniques in

the treatment of a paretic limb and its grasp function was evaluated by patients in a feedback

survey. The annex features the case study of a patient, including a description of the

performed creative activity and its pictorial documentation.
