The presented master thesis brings a well-developed study. The research is based on a sound theoretical foundation, critically accountable. The thesis shows a systematic structure. The candidate demonstrates knowledge of the research problem and the ability to

work independently and critically.

Concerning the originality of the study, the topic and the main research objectives are certainly novel, both within the context of deepfakes research and journalism studies. The thesis presents the issue from an unusual perspective and sort of de-demonize the use of deepfakes technology. I believe it contributes to the discussion by offering an alternative narrative. On the other hand, a narrow definition of the research problem limits the possibility of being recognized as a significant contribution to the academic knowledge discussion. However, this might change in the future. The deepfakes technology and its potential impact on broader societal realities are

The thesis is focused on a specific, very narrow theme. The subject is original, and the methodology is adequate. The individual chapters are well written. The only flaw I see is the lack of summarization of what was the main concerns of the respondents.
