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## **Evaluation**

#### Major criteria:

The thesis investigates Russian dis/misinformation campaigns targeting Western countries and asks whether the Western understanding does not fall into cultural and geographical misconceptions about the Russian strategy. Mainly, the research compares campaigns undertaken before and during the war in Ukraine. The research design is, perhaps, a bit ambitious, considering the available empirical material that can be gather on the matter right now. More precisely, it is unclear whether it is possible to answer all the research questions, some of them quite general, now and whether the thesis does not rather address a narrower issue. The conceptual debate is solid, however, does not help to fully inform the empirical analysis. On top of that, there is a gap between what can be gathered from the case studies and the information necessary to answer the rather general research questions in full.
