

## Abstrakt

This Bachelor thesis pursues the topic of Finland's basic income experiment 2017 – 2018, and its validity for the Czech Republic. The main focus of this thesis is on describing the experiment and contextualizing it within a welfare state / Finland's social security system. It also gives examples of other similar experiments. In the theoretical part, the author explains the theory of the welfare state and libertarianism, which provided the basis for the concept of minimum guaranteed income. In the analytical section, the author presents the results of Finland's experiment, the feasibility of the implementation in the Czech Republic, and a comparison of Finnish and Czech social security systems. The expert interviews proved to be a crucial input for understanding the issue in its complexity.
