

Abstract

This bachelor thesis deals with the economic populism of the Czech political movement ANO and the Polish party Law and Justice. It first outlines the historical context of populism in both countries and then discusses the theory associated with populism and its economic side. This will be followed by an analysis that will show in greater detail the functioning of both political entities in the period 2015-2021.
