Abstract

Title: Management of beach soccer in the Czech Republic

Objectives: The main objective of this thesis was to present recommendations

for the management of beach soccer in the Czech Republic

derived from its analysis on the basis of sequential management

functions, such as planning, organizing, selecting and deploying

staff, leading people and controlling. This analysis, which is a

secondary objective and precedes the main objective, was

performed by comparing the responses, attitudes and opinions of

the respondents of the semi-structured interviews regarding the

functioning of beach soccer management.

Methods: Internal documents analysis, semi-structured interviews with a top

beach soccer manager, Chief coach of the national teams and two

players of beach soccer

Results: The result of this thesis is a series of recommendations for the

management of beach soccer in the Czech Republic based on its

previous analysis. The author sees the most significant problem in

the strategic goals, which are set quite unrealistically. A new

strategic plan is proposed, in which the required number of

members in 2028 is rapidly reduced, which also results in an

analogous reduction in the required number of teams and leagues.

In addition, it was also proposed to reduce the number of newly

built pitches across the Czech Republic from five to one, which

development is conditioned by setting up such a concept that the

nisi only beach soccer pitch in the Czech Republic is filled to its

peak capacity.

Another recommendation thrives from the insufficient

quality of men's national team trainings. The head coach

of the national teams is proposed coaching the men's national

team as he holds a UEFA PROFI license as this would enhance

the quality of the trainings and the quality of the team itself.

The last recommendation is to improve communication between the top management and the national team section. Firstly, coaches will submit a post-event report for the management after each event with a fixed deadline for submission. Second, fixed intervals for organizational meetings will be set. Third, management will consult planned changes before their implementing with other beach soccer members in order to achieve greater objectivity and a higher probability that these planned changes will be set within their capabilities.
