














# Media selection

Andy Ngo has been documented affiliating and organizing with groups such as the Proud Boys and Patriot Prayer, watching as they attack protesters and then only uploading the response, making it seem as though the aforementioned groups were attacked unprovoked.

I believe the video depicts accurate information about the mental health issues of the trans community. If we take the data that was presented as true it is a troubling trend. But there are always two sides to every story. For example: if it's true that the trans community is on a percentage basis much more prone to radicalization we have to ask why. If we leave that as a blanket statement people are left to their own assumptions. If you're liberal you'll likely say it's because they are oppressed and under attack. If you're conservative you'll say they have metal health issues and need help. I don't believe you have to pick a side here. Both positions can be true.

I think that while fox does tend to be more conservative, they did a good job looking at actual facts and numbers and giving a true portrayal

Video does not provide enough information. Obviously the guest is biased bc all that he is researching/writing about is focused on radicalized leftists. But he doesn't provide enough data for me to say to what extent there is bias. I would need to be a better expert on the subject to have a stronger opinion.

Tucker Carlsons disgusting rhetoric seeks only to villainize trans people and remove them from the population. the fact that a rally held to raise awareness about anti trans legislation was used as a talking point attempting to paint trans people as the problem was distasteful at least.

Tucker Carlson is a known propagator of misinformation and is known to misrepresent facts in his stories in order to further spread fear and hate among people who don't have other sources of information. This is another example of Carlson's show making an attempt to further promote fear of the trans community according to their usual method of applying an obscure (often unreliable) piece of information to all people within a group to foster hate.

I think the video raises one valid point of discussion - can lack of regulation of child gender transition be harmful and lead to distress? However it makes the point with an extreme bias equating all those who support young people transitioning with terrorism. The tone is not neutral and misleading, presenting what is essentially propaganda as a news debate.

I don't like tucker Carlson

I believe the guest didn't have a bias, they just presented what they were there to present. And it was the fox host who would take the information just stated and twist the information to fit their narrative about any involvement in the trans community causes harm/danger.

My biggest issue with the reporting is that many rates and statistics are mentioned without giving the actual, objective numbers and letting the audience draw conclusions.

It would be better journalism if Ngo presented some figures from the studies mentioned or examples of online extremism referenced. Carlson is clearly in agreement, not merely reporting.

This is yellow journalism at its worst.

I like to listen to both sides, and let me make the decision as to what is something I align with most. The video presents mostly evidence and a bit of opinions. Something that is more easily



digestible and evidence is the concrete piece of information needed.

I believe this news outlet purposely used the events that happened at the christian school as a way to target the extremist trans community. They portray them as violent extremist with metal issue that paint them in a bad light. The two folks talking also refer to them in a disrespectful way, making it evident that their own opinions were inputed into this discussion, thus making this news segment extremely biased.

It was accurately presented, there is an agenda with targeting the young in the transgender movement.



It seems to negatively stereotype trans people.



i believe this video implies that trans/non cis gender people are prone to violence, and ignores that that violence is a reaction to the violence these people have probably experiences their entire lives.



I am not familiar with the parties being interviewed, but part of protecting LGBTQ+ identities is allowing them to be included in health and sexual education courses. I am not aware if the schools they are talking about include this in kindergarten like they are claiming, although I am doubtful based on my own Californian education, but if they are really concerned about exposing children to health classes too early then the conversation would be centered on when to teach health classes and not if queer people should be included. It seems to be the classic "think of the children" strategy used by the right since before stonewall

I believe everything in this video is accurate and as a conservative this is very concerning. I feel that this video is biased towards opinions that are not my own but not in as extreme a way as the Tucker Carlson segment viewed previously. Nonetheless, I feel it largely misrepresents current political situations to viewers by expressing sentiments not grounded in fact (the statement that abortion is not an important issue for the midterms and the statement that democrats are indoctrinating youth somehow).

Again, the video asks a valid question - is gender education appropriate in public school settings for young children? However it presents the premise based on opinion and all three people speaking were echoing each other's views, so it's impossible to make an informed impression about the situation.

Education is important in Florida and sexual explicit materials should not be part of the system.


Certain matters regarding sexuality are not appropriate to be discussed in school.



the news segment starts off as a summary of facts that leads into interviews with the person of interest who is the direct focus of extremist hate. the only clear bias the media shows is in favor of dismantling hate groups and eliminating their impact on the people they target.

I feel that this is a good solid news story. A real activist facing problems of violence should be reported on and she handled it in a calm manner, eventually offering compassion to those oppressing her. However, I cannot comment on whether it furthers a specific agenda for cnn because news companies are for profit businesses. I do not believe that the video strives to achieve a political agenda and I do think it was done in the least biased manner possible.

This video presented a lot more sources rather than relying on guests representing a specific viewpoint. However, the narrative was still following a particular moral agenda. More voices on the matter would have been helpful.

Not objective

The guest conveyed the actions they took to stop the harassment, and was presenting information about the source of their harassment.

Again, local news story made national because it fits the broader political narrative.

All mainstream media are paid mouthpieces.

This is a very clear moralizing piece for the left, with interview cuts showing the damage caused by a right wing group while the narrator details a "David and Goliath" story of it being defeated. The reporting is very well done, focusing primarily on actual events rather than interpretation.

The report on an event exactly like the subject describes. Like the Fox segments, they don't bring on any counterpoints or claim to have verified anything.

I agree with the argument in the CNN first video, but I am aware that it is biased.

No opinion on this matter, as if terms of service were violated from users - then yeah, the right to ban/delete is fine. But if no terms of service are being violated, then is alright as the people there are grown up and should know what platform they are signup to.

What I like about this particular news segment is that it is not biased and does not push any personal ideologies to the public, but rather inform one of the danger some social media

I believe there are many hate groups that use platforms to advance their agendas. And this exposed one form of them.



Harassment and hate actions should always be banned and removed.


CNN reshapes the news just to get more views. The girl in question did not get harassed because she was trans but because she engaged in online troll wars with other people. News people are bending some truths.

Because this video is from the point of view of the victim, the explanation of motivations for using sites like Kiwi are limited.



They do not present a list of books or show examples of what is being used to remove the books and only provide inferences to why without letting the audience decide. while the video does a good job of showing both sides of the story, allowing de santis and shriver the opportunity to express why the books should or should not be banned, it fails to capitalize on a singular argument as being "correct", and rather attempts to make de santis' argument look weak purely by juxtaposing it alongside shriver, who's area of expertise is within the topic at hand. while the video makes clear that de santis' position is politically motivated(which is indicative of bias on the part of de nantis and the media outlet who seeks to minimalize do santis' argument by attacking his intentions), it still spreads his misinformed argument to a wider audience.

I think this is quality journalism because opinions from both sides were presented. I believe it does attempt to be unbiased because it frames the issue as political and provides speakers from both parties, however I would say it is slightly biased towards the democratic viewpoint because there were more speakers expressing their perspective.

This was a less propagandist video, since it included footage of the opposing representative (Santis). Nevertheless, no information shared of the books, or opinions from teachers and parents.

This piece feels balanced, with the message I took being that the state and the publishers are arguing over acceptable content in textbooks. The left and right wing explanations are both given, and each with a very limited amount of evidence.

They explain the issues and provide both sides.

I agree with the argument in the video. CRT is not ever taught in primary and secondary schools. It is a critical lens theory used in college like Deconstructionalism and Historicism. It



is something that the far right has latched onto to target anti racist teaching practices. But. I am aware that this video is not objective.

Each news station will always give biased opinions to suit and make its viewers happy



They can be biased.


I find internet more reliable where everyone has a voice and nothing gets corrected or edited or chosen to be released. The channels are controlled by people who either have power or money.


Mainstream media's messages are biased in both the messages they tell and the stories, or side of the story, that they present.
