Course of defence: The student began by overviewing the general theme of his research

and objectives. Then the student presented his research questions and outlined the motivation for his interest in the topic, which was rooted in the empirics of the case of Scotland and its position vis-a-vis other similar cases of states following feminist foreign policies. Following that, the student outlined some existing literature, noted gaps in it and suggested how he wished to shed light on the blind spots. Moving on, the student discussed his four key concepts, in some detail and

with the view to showing their importance for the research

objectives. Methodologically speaking, the student chose qualitative content analysis, something he followed up with a discussion regarding his time frame and data selection. Turning to finding, the student outlined the results of his study in a three categories and commented on each, providing empirical evidence and examples, and outlined some conclusions. Moving on to reviews, the student mentioned a critique of his short literature review, definitions, which he justified in terms of keeping the work concise and Scotland-specific. Another critique was about his approach not being sufficiently critical, the student did not necessarily agree. The committee lauded the student's choice of topic and had no questions

except whether the student considered publishing.
