Title of bachelor thesis: Occupational therapy for patients with injuries associated with use

of addictive substances

Abstract of bachelor thesis:

The bachelor thesis focuses on people who have suffered an injury as a result of

substance abuse. Its aim is to map and describe the most common injuries that occur under the

influence of addictive substances, to determine their impact on the course and success of the

rehabilitation process and to point out the specifics of working with this type of patients.

The theoretical part begins with an introduction to addictology, where important terms

and the concept of addiction are explained. Then it focuses on the specific addictive substances

under which injuries most often occur – alcohol, cannabis, opioids and opiates. Other chapters

address specific common injuries and the use of occupational therapy, followed by chapters

discussing the work of the occupational therapist with patients with addiction and the impact of

addictive substances on the rehabilitation process.

In the practical part, elements of qualitative research were used. First, the data collection

methods are mentioned, followed by an analysis of the semi-structured interviews conducted

with 4 respondents. This analysis is divided into 5 main categories: general issues, cooperation

with patients after substance use related injuries, course of rehabilitation, cooperation with the

multidisciplinary team and outcomes and long-term follow-up of rehabilitation.

The bachelor thesis concludes with a summary of the results, among which frequently

recurring problems in rehabilitation were identified. These may consist in their tendency to hide

their addiction, which can lead to serious consequences, prolonged length of hospitalisation and

frequent relapse, refusal to cooperate and, above all, the absence of an addictologist in the

multidisciplinary team.
