2) In the implications chapter, you describe a way in which your findings could be used to provide support for families. Do you think

it is more important to focus primarily on ensuring

that all children are well prepared for school or rather that the school is able to deal with children with different levels of school readiness? Prof. Tesar noted that the candidate addressed most of his questions in her presentation and asked the remaining two questions:

7. How can the insights from your study, conducted in a specific part of China, inform our understanding of school readiness in different cultural, socioeconomic, and educational contexts both within China and globally?

In the general discussion, assoc. professor Jana Stará asked about the
