

Abstract

The diploma thesis deals with the experiences of women from the Philippines who work in the Czech Republic in the manufacturing sector. The author performs an intersectional analysis across themes of gender, class, and migration. The objectives of this theses are to analyze of the impact of a particular type of temporary employment (residence status and working conditions) on the social life of the migrants, as well as a reflection on the effects of the temporary labor migration on the practice of transnational family relationships. Qualitative research is conducted using the method of semi-structured interviews with migrant women from the Philippines, along with other stakeholders from employment agencies, state administration, and non-profit organizations.
