# Reviewer's commentary according to the above criteria:

In his Bachelor's thesis, Leo Becker developed a persuasive account of climate-related civil disobiedience which yields conditions for justification of illegal forms of climate protests. He does so by delving with philosophical skill and methodological rigour into the current scholarly debates about the justification of civil disobiedience and the climate-justice theory, adapting the radical-democratic justificatory strategy as the foundation for his theoretical framework for assessment of illegal protests in the name of climate justice. In the process, Leo Becker shows himself in full command of the philosophical resources expected of a student pursuing an interdisciplinary degree, and his argumentative skills are put to a good effect. While it may be difficult to point to specific failures, Leo Becker's thesis can be characterised as solid rather than groundbreaking, since its contribution consists in careful consideration of the usefulness of the conceptual resources found in the ongoing scholarly debates. The third, "applied" part of the thesis yields modest but not negligable results, since it would seem that Leo Becker's theory emerges as a potential guide for the future climate protests, specifying conditions for such protests which have not been met so far. A more humorous

and less charitable (but probably unwarranted) reading of the third chapter might be that the analysis of the actual climate protests in Germany shows that protests that would meet the conditions specified by Leo Becker's theory are unlikely to take place. The long summary of all chapters of the thesis presented towards the end of the thesis strikes one – given the brevity of the thesis – as somewhat repetitive, although not useless.

### Proposed grade (A-B-C-D-E-F): A

#### Suggested questions for the defence are:

What might explain the virtual absence of the climate protests in Germany that would follow the pattern implied in Leo Becker account of climate-related civil disobedience?
