establishment of the Czechoslovak Republic" I deal with the origin, characteristics and

history of caricature in the theoretical part. Satire became a prerequisite for the emergence

of humorous magazines in the middle of the 19th century. "Humor Sheets" were

published from 1858 by J. R. Vilímek senior and were published intermittently until 1941.

At that time, it was a unique title of Czech humorous and satirical periodicals. J. R.

Vilímek left the publishing of the magazine to his son, J. R. Vilímek junior in 1907.

I focus on the autors who wrote contributions to "Humor Sheets". In the practical part of

the bachelor's thesis, I concentrate on specially focused issues of some years. For example

year of the magazine 51, number 48 called "From the Animal Kingdom" or number 49

dedicated to the National Theater for its 25th anniversary, or number 28 dedicated to the

Sokol number from year of the magazine 55.
