ABSTRACT (EN)

The bachelor's thesis will focus on the church treasury of St. George's Basilica at Prague Castle, the fragments of which are now partially located in St. Vitus Cathedral treasure and the Strahov Monastery treasure. Temple treasures were used to safeguard precious liturgical objects, often characterized by intricate and costly craftsmanship, such as reliquaries, liturgical books, liturgical vessels, liturgical textiles, and episcopal insignia. The presented bachelor's thesis aims to characterize the phenomenon of the church treasure, specify the contents of St. George's Basilica treasury, illustrate how individual items were used in conventual liturgy, and potentially during para-liturgical performances documented in St. George's basilica. The catalogue section will provide a detailed description of preserved works that belonged to the St. George's treasury during the medieval period.
