Empirický materiál pro analýzu zahrnuje:

(1) přepisy veřejných vystoupení pákistánských politických představitelů a záznamy jejich interní komunikace se zástupci americké vlády. Konkrétně byly analyzovány rozhovory pro média, oficiální projevy a prohlášení, tiskové zprávy, komuniké, diplomatické nót, memoranda, telegramy, dopisy a přepisy telefonických rozhovorů, které vznikly v analyzovaných letech a následně byly sesbírány, v případě potřeby přeložené do angličtiny a zveřejněny v následujících zdrojích:

- V odborném časopise *Pakistan Horizon*, vydávaném Pákistánským ústavem mezinárodních vztahů, v rubrice „dokumenty“¹
