Short summary

The thesis focuses on analyzing the effects of various crisis management measures used by national authorities in resolving systemic banking crises on subsequent economic recovery. The analysis is well done and the results are properly discussed.

Contribution

This thesis provides the man value added in using an updated dataset until 2023, a new method not yet used to analyze this phenomenon (diff-in-diff), and a more granular and precise timing of various national measures. While there is some literature on how various crisis management measures used by national authorities help tackle systemic banking crises, the findings are mixed so this thesis contributes to the literature with new results.

Methods

The thesis uses a diff-in-diff methodology to analyze the effects of crisis management measures on subsequent real GDP growth and house price recovery. This is an appropriate approach to single out the effect of the measures from the effects that may come from other sources. The dataset for the analyses is prepared with great care and attention to details.

Literature

The thesis reviews the available literature, main conclusions and findings are discussed.

Manuscript form

The thesis is well formatted and easy to read.

In my view, the thesis fulfills the requirements for a Master's thesis at IES, Faculty of Social Sciences, Charles University, I recommend it for the defense and suggest a **grade A**. The results of the Turnitin analysis do not indicate significant text similarity with other available sources.
