

Abstract

This bachelor thesis deals with the deserted medieval village Záhoví in the Louny district. Thus far, the site in question has not been much studied from an archaeological point of view. In this work, a critical review of the written sources was made, the geodetical-topographical survey of village relicts was carried out and the overall plan of the site was created. The resident form and the form of the yards of particular estates were reconstructed on the basis of the survey. This work contributes to a deeper knowledge of the Czech medieval village and settlement forms of the 14th and 15th century.
