The thesis deals with the significant phenomenon of intimate partner violence (IPV), which is innovatively linked to the phenomenon of internal displacement. The aforementioned thesis is supported by the gendered idea of hyper-masculinity and patriarchal backlash.

The research design of the thesis is exemplary and the author's analysis very convincing. Statistical multilevel logistic regression analysis shows that sexual violence, as one form of IPV, is exacerbated by internal displacement. I also appreciate that the author reflects on possible methodological and data limitations.
