family members, volunteers and members of the staff team.

All these participants are not always actively involved in the art therapy session, their

implication can be also passive. However in both cases they benefit of certain creative

and experience values. Art techniques are purposely chosen to have an easy technical

process so that they respect client's health condition and desire to accomplish a final

product. The clients chose to profit from both forms of individual and group art therapy.

Art activity brings kind of release from illness and becomes a gratification.
