

Pokorný, V., To think from psychedelic experiences. Transdisciplinary interpretation. Disertation Thesis, Departement of General Anthropology, Faculty of Humanities, Charles University Prague, 2016

Abstract: The goal of this text is to think from and according to psychedelic experiences. To think from psychededic experiences means to introduce a transdisciplinary model of psychedelic domain. This model is based on autoethnographic, cognitive, phenomenological and psychopharmacological types of analysis. These analyses allow to demonstrate: 1) place of psychedelics in contemporary globalised czech society; 2) possible heuristic (theoretical and experiemental) value of psychedelic experience for understanding human situation. This text interprets psychedelic experience as a process of deterritorialization and reterritorialization that occurs on different, intertwined levels of our experience, and, thus, it is a contribution to explication of a philosophical concept of intertwining.
