OVERALL ASSESSMENT (provided in English, Czech, or Slovak):

The Rigorous thesis of Blanka Weyskrabová is a slightly modified version of her Diploma thesis. It analyses the remittance and migration with the focus on Ukrainian workers living in the Czech Republic. The thesis has contributed to the general knowledge about migration in economic sense and is especially valuable for the target country (CZ) because Ukrainian workers are the most important working minority in the Czech Republic. It gives beneficial insight into this field and helps understanding the problems of migration and related remittances.

The thesis is centered on two hypotheses. In a nutshell, what determines remittances and how are they spent. The results suggest that main determinants of migration and subsequent remitting are demographic characteristics and income of the emigrant's family. As for the second question remittances are spent both on non-productive (food and clothes) and productive (mainly house construction) consumption. Education, or investment in it, seem not to be relevant.

The comments and suggestion mentioned in the last opponent's review were addressed in a satisfactory manner with exception of those questioning the data sample and the significance/popularity of Czech Republic in Ukraine from the remittance point of view. The latter point could not have been addressed given the nature of the research question and data available. Otherwise, the level of English was improved by proofreading. Ukraine as a state was introduced in more detailed way and "productiveness of spending" was also made more clear. Typos were eliminated.

The author of the thesis was granted "Česká spořitelna Award" for the research performed and won recognition from Dean of the Faculty of Social Sciences for an extraordinarily good master diploma thesis. Both of these have further proved the quality of the thesis. I recommended the thesis to be defended as excellent a year ago and I do recommend it also this time.
